Fire Services

Fire Services

- Fire Services responded to 4 incidents. 1 public service, 1 motor vehicle, 1 public hazard and 1 medical.
- A meeting was held at Leeds Station 1 to discuss emergency responses on waterways and lakes and to clarify the responsibilities of the various services involved. The attendees included OPP, RCMP, EMS, Border Services, Brockville Police, Gananoque Fire, Howe Island Fire, Parks Canada, and the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry. The focus of the meeting was on marine familiarization and how each service can contribute to ensuring safety on the water.
- 510lbs of non-perishable food and approximately \$250 in cash and cheques received through the Fire Chief Association Food Drive were delivered to ROLL Aid Food Bank.

Regional Training Center

- The recruit class who completed their FFI written and practical exams officially started at their respective stations, Monday April 15.
- Staff met with CP Rail Safety regarding a potential partnership in rail safety training through the Leeds Regional Training Center.
- Written and driver licensing was completed for the Perth Fire Department under the DCP program.
- Redemption codes for the upcoming MFPA 1041 Instructor 1 course were distributed to 3 members enrolled from Leeds.

Fire Prevention

- Several authorities including Leeds Fire, OPP, Township Building and By-law staff, Electrical Safety Authority, Ministry of Natural Resources, and Community Housing conducted a joint inspection at a residence in the Township.
- Staff attended the Leeds and Grenville Fire Prevention meeting in Merrickville.
- The Fire Chief and FPO Richardson met with Border Services and the Thousand Island Bridge Authority to discuss emergency responses to the border and bridge during construction season.
