## DID YOU KNOW...

• A portion of your municipal tax bill includes monies that are sent to the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville, and area school boards. The balance funds municipal services like fire, OPP, roads, parks, libraries and waste disposal sites.

The TLTI tax rate is the second lowest in the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville out of 10 municipalities.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) determines the assessment for properties across Ontario. Municipalities set the tax rate based on the annual budget approved by Council. The assessment value multiplied by the tax rate equals the tax you pay for your property.

For a residential property with an assessment of \$200,000, the monthly property tax bill is approximately \$165. Of that, the Township's portion is approximately \$76.
