• Fire Services responded to 8 emergency incidents this last week: 3 mutual aid requests; including 1 tanker support for Rideau Lakes, 1 for a pumper and crew in Gananoque, 1 for a tankers and personal in Front of Yonge. 2 medical assistance calls on the river, which response came from the new fire boat, 1 hydro pole on fire, 1 fire activated fire alarm and 1 medical call.

Fire Administration cont'd

- Fire services in collaboration with staff from Ontario Parks (Charleston Lake Provincial Park), Parks Canada, and the Ministry of Natural Resources (AFFES), conducted the first ever Prescribed Burn for Charleston Lake Provincial Park. The objective of this burn was to restore provincially significant Pitch Pine on three of the islands in Donaldson Bay. Fire services had staff on site to assist.
- Marine 3 is officially in service for the summer. It is moored at Brennan Marine in Gananoque. This marine unit will help to protect the islands and the residents in the more westerly portion of the Township. Having the second boat in the water cuts down the time of response by not having to launch during an emergency. Gananoque Fire will also have its marine unit in the water to further protect the area residents.
- Washer/ extractors were delivered to the three stations to be connected and put in service. These units were purchased using grant money earmarked for Cancer Prevention that was provided by the Ontario Fire Marshall's Office (OFM).
