Noise By-Law

Noise is regulated within the Township by the Township's Noise By-Law. The By-law includes general restrictions on certain types of noise as well as time-based restrictions for certain activities. Certain events, such as anniversaries, birthdays, and weddings where there will be amplified sound/music, or overnight/weekend construction, may be eligible for a Noise By-law Exemption. 
Docks, Boathouses & Zoning Compliance

Planning & Development staff encourage those considering work to construct or alter a marine facility to contact the Township in advance to confirm zoning compliance and potential Building Permit requirements.

A marine facility is an accessory building or structure located on, over, under or immediately adjacent to a water body used to moor, berth or store a boat. This includes a launching ramp, boat lift, dock, boathouse, marine railway, water intake, pump house or similar structure/use. Marine facilities include both floating and permanent structures.

A permit under Ontario Regulation 148/06 may also be required from the Cataraqui Region Conservation Authority. Please contact their office at 613-546-4228.

To request a review, please submit an accurate, detailed plan of the existing development and a separate plan of what is proposed. Please include the frontage of the property, measurements of all marine facility structures, height (measured from the peak to the water), setback to side yard straight line projections, and the year the existing structures were built. There is no Township fee to pre-consult on your proposal.



Planning staff will advise if your proposal meets the applicable provisions of the Zoning By-Law or if you will require additional planning approval (i.e. minor variance, zoning by-law amendment). Staff will also advise if a building permit will be required.


Building Permits

Did you know that a building permit is required for the following types of projects?

- all new residential and commercial buildings, renovations and additions,
- new or replacement septic systems
- in-ground, or above-ground pools and associated decks,
- boathouses/boat ports and shore docks,
- stairways leading to docks or waterfront
- decks (new or repair/replacement),
- Sheds/garages /accessory buildings larger than 15 square metres if for storage only associated to a primary use. This includes site-built or prefabricated and shipping containers
- Any structure/accessory building that includes plumbing, regardless of size
- Sleeping Cabins, regardless of size
- tents (open or enclosed) larger than 60 square metres,
- demolition of structures,
- plumbing and gas systems,
- heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems,
- fireplaces and wood burning appliances,
- replacing furnaces or hot water tanks

Please note that all new development must comply with the zoning by-law. A plan showing the location of a proposed structure with setbacks to property lines and from other structures should be submitted to the Township for review.

This list is general and not exhaustive. Your project may have specific Ontario Building Code requirements. Before starting any construction or demolition, please contact Township Building staff to discuss your project and confirm zoning compliance and other requirements. Please note that structures built without a building permit may be subject to fines and/or increased fees.

Recycling changes coming July 1

The Township of Leeds and the Thousand Islands is transitioning its Blue Box program to the <u>Producer Responsibility Framework</u>, https://www.circularmaterials.ca/what-is-epr/, under <u>Circular Materials</u>, https://www.circularmaterials.ca/about/.

What does this mean for you?

Village of Lansdowne Residents:

- Curb-side pickup of Recycling will be performed by Emterra Environmental Inc.
- Pickup day is Monday; Tuesday, if Monday is a holiday.
- Recycling items must be sorted by type: 1. Plastics, metal, aluminum, and glass in a transparent bag; 2. Paper and Cardboard flattened and tied or in a transparent bag.
- Questions about missed collection or replacement of recycling bins can be directed to <u>customercareont@emterra.ca</u> or 1-888-597-1541.
- Emterra is collecting recycling and solid waste (household garbage) in the Village of Lansdowne.

Township Waste Disposal Site Users:

- Users will see new bins and signage provided by Emterra Environmental Inc.
- Recycling processes remain the same:
 - Keep beverage containers, glass, flexible and rigid plastics, and metal materials together
 - Keep Paper materials separate from the above.

Fire Services

Is Your Private Road or Laneway Accessible to Emergency Vehicles?

In an emergency, every second counts – and access is everything. Our fire trucks, ambulances, and other emergency vehicles require a minimum clear width of 6 metres (20 feet) and a vertical clearance of 5 metres (16.5 feet) to safely reach your property.

The laneway or road surface must also be built and maintained to support the weight of a fully loaded fire tanker, which can exceed 30 tonnes. Overgrown vegetation, soft surfaces, or narrow gates can delay or even prevent emergency response.

Equally important: make sure your 911 property marker is clearly visible from both directions of travel, day or night. Emergency responders rely on these signs to locate your property quickly – a faded, blocked, or missing sign can cost precious time.

We encourage all residents with private roads or laneways to check their access routes and signage,

and make any necessary improvements to ensure we can reach you when it matters most.

Open Air Burning in TLTI: What You Need to Know

Open air burning can be a safe and useful way to manage brush and enjoy outdoor fires, but it must be done responsibly. In the Township, burn permits are free for all residents and can be easily obtained online at lti.burnpermits.com or by stopping by the Township Office during business hours. Despite this, in 2024, over \$19,000 in fines were issued to individuals who failed to follow the Open Air Burn By-law. Even more concerning, unsupervised fires led to three total-loss structure fires, all of which were preventable.

To protect your property, your neighbours, and our first responders:

- Always obtain a valid burn permit, they are free to all Township residents
- Follow all conditions outlined in the by-law and call your permit in every day you would like to burn
- Never leave a fire unattended
- Burn only when conditions are safe

What3words

Did you know that the Township of Leeds and the Thousand Islands includes hundreds of wateraccess-only properties throughout the 1000 Islands region of the St. Lawrence River, Rideau Canal and numerous lakes? In an emergency, every second counts and providing an exact location can be a challenge when addresses or landmarks are unclear.

That's where what3words comes in.



What3words is a free app that divides the world into 3-metre squares, each assigned a unique threeword address (<u>https://w3w.co/thankfully.gazebo.gratitude</u>). This makes it easy to communicate your exact location to emergency responders — even from the dock, the water, or deep in the woods. We encourage all residents and seasonal visitors to download the free what3words app, locate and save the three-word address for your dock, cottage, and any common meeting point, and share it with guests and family. It could save valuable time in an emergency.

Door-to-Door Campaign: Educating Our Waterfront Community

This summer, Leeds 1000 Islands Fire Service is expanding the Dock-to-Door Campaign in partnership with the Thousand Islands Association (TIA). Firefighters will visit seasonal cottages along the water to educate residents about critical fire safety topics, including the essential need for working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in every residence, including seasonal cottages.

Smoke and carbon monoxide alarms save lives by providing early warnings of danger. Regardless of how often you use your cottage, it's vital to have these alarms installed, tested regularly, and maintained to protect you and your loved ones.

As part of the partnership, TIA has generously donated two new portable fire pumps for our new fire boat. This summer, the Fire Prevention Team will host a series of clinics at various locations, demonstrating how to safely operate these pumps.

These clinics are designed especially for island residents, teaching how having a fire pump on hand can help contain fires before Emergency Fire Services arrive, potentially preventing major damage.
