How to apply for Lottery Licences

All lotteries in Ontario such as raffles, bingos, 50/50 draws, and break-open tickets require a licence through the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO). For certain lotteries under \$50,000 the AGCO has delegated lottery licence issuing to municipalities. To be eligible for lottery licences, organizations must be not-for-profit or charitable. The proceeds of the licence must be used for charitable purposes. Organizations that wish to apply for a lottery licence need to fill out the Eligibility Questionnaire found on the Township Website. An application must be submitted following the acknowledgement that the organization is eligible to apply for a licence. Planning and Development

Community Improvement Plan Spring Submission

The spring submission deadline for Community Improvement Applications is Friday, May 30th. The first step in the application process is to consult with Planning staff to review your proposed project and review eligibility requirements. If you have any questions regarding a project, please contact the Planning Staff.



Civic Addressing

All developed properties, including seasonal properties accessed by private lanes, are required to have a reflective civic blade and post installed at their driveway to assist emergency services with locating your property. The Township can issue civic addresses to vacant land and recommends a civic address for any property being farmed or with a recreational type use. An approved entrance permit from the applicable road authority is required prior to the issuance of a civic address. If you have not been issued a blade and post, or your blade or post has gone missing or is damaged, please contact the Planning Technician at planningtechnician@townshipleeds.on.ca or 613-659-2415 x 203. The fee for a blade is \$25 and the fee for the post is \$20.

New Ontario Building Code

The 2024 Building Code became effective January 1, 2025. A summary of the Building Code Changes has been prepared and is available on the building permits page of the Township website-https://www.leeds1000islands.ca/en/growing/Building-Permits.aspx.



Questions about Building Permits...

As construction season is approaching, please be reminded that Building permits are required for all the following structures/construction.

- Accessory buildings over 10 sq m (108 sq ft).
 Sheds, greenhouses, gazebos.
- Accessory buildings, used for storage only on residential properties over 15 sq m.
- All decks, attached to structures regardless of size or height above grade.
- Detached decks over 10 sq. m
- Bunkies over 10 sq. m in size. Bunkie are considered bedrooms and require a septic review regardless of size.
- Access stairs to structure or properties (i.e. from the water to a cottage/house)
- Inground and above ground pools, hot tubs and swim spas.

All structures, whether they require a building permit or not, are required to comply with the Township Zoning By-law and obtain CRCA permits if they are to be located in an area regulated by the Conservation Authority. If you have questions reach out to the building or planning staff.

By-law Enforcement

Complaints can be submitted to the Township through the Township's website, <u>Ask a Question and Report a Problem form</u>, which is monitored Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The Township contracts Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement to provide By-law enforcement services **outside of regular Township business hours** for complaints related to At-Large or Injured Dogs and the Noise By-law.

You can contact Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement at 613-541-3213. This is an answering service only, please leave specific details including:

- 1. your name;
- 2. the address of the property of concern; and
- 3. phone number where you can be reached.

Once a complaint is received, Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement or a staff member may contact the complainant if any questions or further clarification are required.

Ontario law requires smoke alarms on every floor of your home and outside all sleeping areas. To ensure your alarms are functioning, test them monthly and replace the batteries annually.

This year, our Fire Prevention Team will be going door-to-door to educate residents about the importance of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, how they work, and the best locations for installation.

Burn Permits: Don't Forget to Renew

Residents of the Township of Leeds and the Thousand Islands (TLTI) are required to have a permit for open-air burning. The good news is that burn permits are free for all TLTI residents!

To apply for or renew your permit, visit https://lti.burnpermits.com/ or stop by the Township Office during business hours.

Once registered, you only need to call 613-704-1812 on the day you plan to burn. Listen to the pre-recorded message to activate your permit for 24 hours.

Dock-to-Door Campaign: Educating Our Waterfront Community

This summer, Leeds 1000 Islands Fire Service is excited to expand the Dock-to-Door Campaign in partnership with the Thousand Islands Association (TIA). Firefighters will visit seasonal cottages along the water to educate residents about the importance of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, fire safety, and more.

As part of this collaboration, the TIA has generously donated two new portable fire pumps for the new fire boat. The Fire Prevention Team will hold a series of clinics at various locations this summer, to showcase the use of these pumps. These clinics will teach island residents how to safely use fire pumps and emphasize the importance of having one available to contain island fires before Emergency Fire Services arrive.

Look for the new fire boat on the St. Lawrence River, and stay updated on upcoming clinic dates through the Fire Department's social media channels and the TLTI website.

LTI Archives

Congratulations to the LTI Archives on receiving the Ontario Library Association Archival and Preservation Achievement Award from the Ontario Library Association.

"Their Opportunity" is a national grassroots children's charity that delivers and subsidizes local sport for development and community engagement programming. "Their Opportunity" is collaborating with "Big Brothers Big Sisters of Leeds and Grenville" to bring some exciting new programs and supports to children and youth in Leeds and Grenville, including sports subsidies!

Sports Subsidy Program

Their Opportunity's longest-standing program pillar is the subsidies program. It's built to help remove the financial barrier to ensure children from all economic backgrounds have an equal opportunity to participate in grassroots sports and recreation. They recommend applying for the subsidy 4-6 weeks before the start of the program, to allow their team time to process the application. 


