The spring submission deadline for Community Improvement Applications is Friday, May 29th. The first step in the application process is to consult with Planning staff to review your proposed project. ## Planning and Development

### Civic Addressing

All developed properties, including seasonal properties accessed by private lanes, are required to have a reflective civic blade and post installed at their driveway to assist emergency services with locating your property. The Township can issue civic addresses to vacant land and recommends a civic address for any property being farmed or with a recreational type use. An approved entrance permit from the applicable road authority is required before a civic address is issued. If you have not been issued a blade and post, or your blade or post has gone missing or is damaged, please contact the Planning Technician at [planningtechnician@townshipleeds.on.ca](mailto:planningtechnician@townshipleeds.on.ca) or 613-659-2415 x 203. The fee for a blade is \$25, and the fee for the post is \$20.



### Dog Tags

All dog owners in the Township are required to purchase a dog tag annually. A reminder to check the expiry date on your building permits. Permits have a one-year expiry date, but can be renewed.



### By-law Enforcement

Complaints can be submitted to the Township through the Township's website, [Ask a Question and Report a Problem](https://www.leeds1000islands.ca/living-here/ask-a-questionreport-a-concern/) page, <https://www.leeds1000islands.ca/living-here/ask-a-questionreport-a-concern/>, which is monitored Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The Township contracts Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement to provide By-law enforcement services **outside of regular Township business hours** for complaints related to At-Large or Injured Dogs and the Noise By-law.

You can contact Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement at 613-541-3213. This is an answering service only, please leave specific details including:

1. your name;
2. the address of the property of concern; and
3. phone number where you can be reached.

Once a complaint is received, Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement or a staff member may contact the complainant if any questions or further clarification are required.

### Questions about Building Permits...

As construction season is approaching, please be reminded that Building permits are required for all the following structures/construction.

- Accessory buildings over 10 sq m (108 sq ft). Sheds, greenhouses, gazebos.
- Accessory buildings, used for storage only on residential properties over 15 sq m.
- All decks, attached to structures regardless of size or height above grade.
- Detached decks over 10 sq m.
- Sleeping cabins 10 sq m in size. Sleeping cabins are considered bedrooms and require a septic review regardless of size.
- Access stairs to a structure or properties (i.e. from the water to a cottage/house).
- Inground and above ground pools, hot tubs and swim spas.

All structures whether they require a building permit or not are required to comply with the Township Zoning By-law and obtain CRCA permits if they are to be located in an area regulated by the Conservation Authority.

### Changes to the Ontario Fire Code for 2026

In 2025, Ontario experienced 110 fatal fires resulting in 125 deaths—an increase from the previous two years. Leeds 1000 Islands Fire Service would like to remind all residents that working smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms save lives.

As of January 1, 2026, updates to the Ontario Fire Code require:

- Smoke alarms on every level of your home
- Carbon monoxide alarms on every level if your home has a fuel-burning appliance or an attached garage

Carbon monoxide is often called the silent killer. It is an odourless, colourless, and tasteless gas produced by incomplete combustion. Exposure can cause headaches, nausea, and, in severe cases, death. This is why it is critical to ensure fuel-burning appliances are properly maintained and that CO alarms are installed as an early warning.

#### What should I do if my alarm goes off?

- 3 beeps (repeating): Smoke alarm
- 4 beeps (repeating): Carbon monoxide alarm

#### If your carbon monoxide alarm activates and no one is experiencing symptoms:

1. Exit the home immediately and move to fresh air
2. Call 911 from outside the house
3. Wait for firefighters to arrive and investigate

#### If someone is experiencing symptoms or cannot leave the home:

- Open doors and windows to bring in fresh air (if safe to do so)
- Call 911 immediately and follow instructions

#### Common causes of CO alarms

Some of the most common sources we encounter include:

- Ashes from woodstoves stored indoors (even if they appear cool)
- Blocked furnace or appliance vents (snow or ice buildup)
- Improperly maintained or damaged heating equipment
- Running vehicles in attached garages
- Faulty or expired CO alarms (over 10 years old, or installed in damp or dusty areas)

#### Keep your alarms working

- Test all alarms monthly
- Replace batteries at least once a year
- Replace the entire unit every 10 years, or as recommended by the manufacturer

In 2025, we hosted several hands-on clinics along the St. Lawrence River, where residents learned:

### Burn Permits: Don't Forget to Renew

Residents of the Township of Leeds and the Thousand Islands (TLTI) are required to have a permit for open-air burning, and the good news is that burn permits are free.

To apply for or renew, visit <https://lti.burnpermits.com/> or stop by the Township Office during business hours.

### Before You Burn

If you plan to burn brush or use a burn barrel/incinerator, you **Must**:

- Call 613-704-1812 on the day you plan to burn.
- Follow the pre-recorded message to activate your permit for 24 hours.

If you are having a campfire (for cooking, warmth, or recreation):

- You do not need to call each time, **but**
- You must still check daily burn conditions

Burn conditions can be checked by:

- Calling the burn line
- Visiting the Township website
- Going to [lit.burnpermits.com](http://lit.burnpermits.com)
