Corporate Services

- Council was presented with the draft operating and capital budgets at a Special Council Meeting on Thursday, December 11. The proposed budget calls for a \$13.5 million net levy requirement, and proposed Township residential tax rate increase of 4.9%. Under the new Strong Mayor legislation O. Reg. 530/22, Council has 30 days from the budget presentation to propose amendments. If no amendments are proposed, the budget is deemed to be adopted once the time lapses.

They do it because they love it and want to help the community. Many of these folks have dedicated most of their lives to the fire service. In TLTI, we have almost 100 firefighters, 15 of whom have 17-56 years of service. The fire service may have changed over the years, but the commitment to the community has not changed.
