Dog Licenses

The Canine Control By-law requires all dogs in the Township to have dog tags, which can be purchased for \$25.00, using cash, cheque, or debit, at the Township office Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you would like your dog tag mailed, please submit your request to

3. phone number where you can be reached.

Once a complaint is received, Frontenac Municipal Law Enforcement, or a staff member may reach out to the complainant if there are questions or further clarification is required.

Leeds 1000 Islands Fire Services

Fire Prevention Week, October 6 - 12, 2024

This year's theme is "Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You!" Whether you're at home, a cottage, or a trailer, properly maintained smoke alarms and a family fire safety plan ensure that everyone in your household can evacuate safely in an emergency.

Smoke Alarm Installation Tips

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (such as a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- Make sure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical challenges.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or do not respond when tested.

Burn Permits

A free Open-Air Burn permit helps keep our community safe and significantly reduces the number of Nuisance Burning calls to our Fire Department. Thank you to all the residents who have obtained one. What3Words

Have you ever been lost and tried to give directions to where you are? Emergency responders are encouraging the public to download the What3words app on their phones. What3words is an easy way to describe any precise location. It divided the world into a grid of 3-metre squares and gives each square a unique address made from 3 random words. Township Day-Use Parks

Thanksgiving Monday signals the close of our 7-day use parks; those with washroom facilities will be winterized and secured.

Private Road Grant

Eligible road associations can apply for financial support for grading and snow removal. The deadline for applications is October 31. Read about our grant programs at www.leeds1000islands.ca/privateroadgrants.

Winter Parking By-law

From December 1 through April 1, street parking is prohibited from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. for snow clearing. Vehicles may be ticketed or towed.

Snowplowing and winter maintenance season is coming!

From November 1 to March 31, the Township performs daily road patrols to monitor conditions and prepare responses to winter weather. Crews use a snow clearing schedule that is based on a road priority system. Sanding/salting and plowing begin on high-use roadways and then move to residential streets. The roads department monitors various weather information sources for a consistent forecast to plan operational responses.

Questions about Building Permits...

Building permits are required for all the following structures/construction.

- Accessory buildings over 10 sq. m (108 sq. ft). Sheds, greenhouses, gazebos
- Accessory buildings, used for storage only on residential properties over 15 sq. m.
- All decks attached to structures regardless of size or height above grade.
- Detached decks over 10 sq m
- Bunkies over 10 sq m in size. Bunkie are considered bedrooms and require a septic review regardless of size.
- Access stairs to structure or properties (i.e. from the water to a cottage/house)
- Inground and above ground pools, hot tubs and swim spas.

All structures whether they require a building permit or not are required to comply with the Township Zoning By-law and obtain CRCA permits if they are to be located in an area regulated by the Conservation Authority.

As fall approaches, please keep in mind that adding insulation to the exterior or interior of your residence or adding a solid-fuel appliance (woodstove) requires a building permit.

We want to thank all the residents, contractors, and authorized agents who have obtained building permits for your current projects and look forward to working with you to complete the project and future projects.

Complete Applications

When submitting an application for a building permit it's important to ensure that your permit application is complete, and that information is sufficiently detailed to enable the design to be assessed for compliance with the Ontario Building Code Act and Building Code.

In addition a detailed plot plan is required to ensure zoning compliance. Incomplete applications will result in delays in the review of applications. To assist in the completion of applications please refer to the [building permit application guide](#) on the Township website.


